The policy at St Albans Primary School for first aid notification is that families are notified by text or phone for significant injuries such as injuries to the head or face, serious grazes, excessive pain, suspected breaks, or illness. We do not notify parents for small cuts, grazes or other minor injuries. Students who are not seriously injured or unwell, will return to class and be supervised by their teacher for any worsening symptoms, if this occurs, we will call you. We will only call home if you need to pick the student up from school, or an ambulance needs to be called. Due to this, please make sure that your phone numbers are correct and if you are unable to collect your child, you have provided an emergency contact number for someone who can collect your child.


