Dear Community,

Welcome back to Term 2, staff and students have settled back into school routine after the holidays and the disruption caused by the global pandemic.

I would also like to thank all of our families for their support with ensuring students are on time for school, the school day starts at 8:50am and if your child is late they miss out on important learning time. The morning session from 8:50am until 11am is focused primarily on reading and literacy, Remember "it is not great to be late" if your child is late, they miss out on fundamental learning processes that will impact their whole learning journey. Reading increases your child's vocabulary, expands your child's understanding of the world and gives them confidence when using language. Reading is also an important way to make the link between spoken words and written words.

We are in process of renovating the hall this term, we have already installed new high windows, painted the internal walls and are now working on repolishing the floors. I look forward to our first assembly in the renovated hall later this term.
