FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Community,

Welcome back! I hope you all had a restful break. It is nice to see all the families and students again after returning from Term 1 holidays. A special welcome to our new families that have started this term.

As we are approaching the winter months can we please ensure your child is wearing appropriate clothing for the cooler weather to keep them warm. Please see the office to purchase any new winter uniform from our uniform shop. If you are needing financial help with the purchase, please see the office.

If your child is unwell, please keep them at home. We have had a number of staff get sick due to unwell children in their class. When this happens, we have to split classes as there are no available substitute teachers, please make sure your children are well before they attend school. If they are unwell, please call the office to let us know. If we have no reason for the absence you will get a text asking for one.

There have been a number of students who are continually late to school and are either picked up early or late after school. We would like to remind parents that school begins and finishes at the same time for all students. Students begin learning time at 8:50am and finish at 3:20pm. We need students to be on time to class so that they can begin learning together. Late comers are disruptive to classes and being late will impact your child's learning. Below is some information on the impact of late arrival.

After 9:15 am is unacceptable

Your child is preparing for the day, learning, spelling, reading. Your child's first lesson has started.

5 minutes late a day means 3 lost school days a year

10 minutes late means 6 lost school days a year

15 minutes late means 9 lost school days a year

After 9:15am children must go to the office to record a late arrival.

Late arrival means children are missing out on socialising and learning.

We understand that occasionally being late is unavoidable but please do your best to bring your children to school on time and pick them up at 3:20pm.

Breakfast is served in the hall every day from 8:00am. Students are able to enter the school grounds from 8am but must go to the hall for breakfast. Playing on the equipment or on the oval is not permitted as they are not supervised before 8:50am.





Education Week Open Morning 27th May 2022
